3. Convey a moderate understanding of the basic teachings to others.

Live Lectures:

Live lectures will be given weekly through WebEX. Each Wednesday at 9:00 EST, 8:00 CST, 7:00 MST and 6:00 PST an hour lecture will be presented on the topic of the week. *See the directions for WebEx in a separate file that will be e-mailed to you along with the WebEx login password upon receipt of payment.*

Student Presentations Each student is responsible for developing and giving a presentation on one of the topics. **The presentation should include your understanding of the teaching and an example of either how you can apply it to your life, or a time when you did apply it, and what the results were.** The order of the presentations will flow according to the week that it was presented in class. For example, The Four Noble Truths will be taught on Week 1 so a student presentation on it would be on Week 2. The Eightfold Path will be taught on Week 5 so the student presentation would be on Week 6. The student presentations will follow the lecture by Rev. Ozuna and come at the end of the class. You can use Microsoft Word or Microsoft PowerPoint to for your presentation but it is not required. If you are going to have visuals, please make sure that you email them in advance to Rev. Ozuna so that they can be posted in advance. Also log in at least 30 minutes early to verify that everything is as you expect it to be. This will reduce your last minute stress and panic.
